Core Purpose

SSF Education and Training Tutors are responsible for delivering high quality training and accreditations directly to young people and to practitioners working across the sport and physical activity sector.

Our training combines youth work principles and sport to develop skills and knowledge. The purpose of our training is to help practitioners to deliver inclusive, accessible and outcome focused sport and physical activity and to provide young people with opportunities to enhance their learning, future prospects and employment opportunities.

Training is delivered across Scotland and includes evening and weekend work. Tutors will deliver a blend of online and face-to-face training.

Key Responsibilities

- Work closely with SSF staff and other freelance tutors to deliver modules using pre-defined learning outcomes (alone or co-delivery).
 - Plan and prepare module delivery based on the needs of the group.
 - Pre-workshop preparation and venue set-up.
 - Attendance at relevant development opportunities including standardisation, updates and CPD.
 - Complete relevant course administration including marking and assessing SCQF accredited coursework.
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Key Responsibilities

- Opportunity to support and contribute to module content and resource development.
 - Promote SSF Education and Training across your networks and engage with SSF social media.
 - Be responsible for a safe learning environment and adhere to all health and safety, child protection and GDPR requirements.
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Essential Experience

- Ability to evidence progressive experience working in a learning environment and specifically in facilitation, group assessments, supporting individual learning, tutoring, teaching, and training.
- Experience of delivering/facilitating training to youth work staff or sport/physical activity practitioners.
- A background in working with young people in a community setting as a youth worker or sports/physical activity practitioner.
- Ability to tailor delivery to the individual needs of a group of learners, using knowledge of teaching, coaching and learner facilitations to create an environment which removes potential barriers to learning.
- Experience of adapting and tailoring training for delivery through different platforms, including face-to-face and online.
- Clear understanding of the SSF Education and Training strand.

Desirable Experience

- Professional Development Award (PDA) in Sport Educator (or working towards) or equivalent tutoring qualification.
- Experience of working with and understanding the issues affecting young people who are facing challenging circumstances and may be disengaging from education.
- Experience of working in sport to address inequalities.
- Experience of working in, delivering, or facilitating training to people with disabilities.
- Knowledge of trauma and Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs).

If your application is shortlisted, we will invite you to attend an interview process on either Monday 16th or Wednesday 18th February 2026. This will consist of practical assessment and interview panel. It is expected that the process would take no more than 1.5 hours.

The time and venue will be confirmed if you are invited to the interview stage. We anticipate interviews will be held in a venue in a central belt location, most likely Stirling or Glasgow.

Further Information

SSF Tutor Training

If you have not already completed SSF Tutor Training, you will be expected to complete our 2-day Tutor Training programme prior to delivering any modules on behalf of SSF.

The training is planned for Wednesday 4th and Wednesday 11th March. This training is mandatory for delivering SSF accredited modules and therefore we are regrettably unable to accept applications from candidates who will not be able to commit to attending this training.

If you have already completed SSF Tutor Training, we will be organising an upskilling session as a refresher and to present new module content. The date and venue for this session will be confirmed in due course.

Further Training and Ongoing Commitments

You will be offered planned check-ins with a member of the SSF Education and Training team and expected to attend an annual Standardisation Day to ensure consistency and quality are maintained.

You will be paid for work you complete in your capacity as a fully signed off Tutor, however you will not be paid to attend training which is required to retain your credentials as an SSF Tutor.

Further Information

Allocation of Tutoring Deployments

You will be deployed directly by SSF to deliver modules in the fairest way possible, taking into consideration tutor availability, geographical location, course requirements, and attempting to ensure an equitable spread of work.

The SSF Education and Training team will inform you of the opportunity to deliver a module and you will be expected to respond within a 2-day timeframe to confirm whether you are available for the delivery.

For tutors generating interest with course organisers themselves directly, you will always be the tutor allocated to those modules, provided you are available and wish to deliver.

Safeguarding and PVG

You must be up to date with Child Protection and Safeguarding training and willing to undertake any required ongoing training.

You must be a PVG scheme member or willing to become one.
